MENTORSHIP

Trauma that happens through relationship must be healed through relationship. Because of this, Allies Mentorship matches survivors of trafficking and sexual exploitation with a mentor to build authentic, unwavering, reliable and trusting friendships to support their flourishing.

A mentor builds a relationship based on trust and acceptance with their mentee, which provides a foundation for positive mental, social, emotional, and physical growth. In the Allies Mentorship Program, youth survivors of trafficking and sexual exploitation will gain an authentic and unwavering relationship as they work on socialization and academic or career skills, receive help, share meals, and have fun!

EVERYDAY ADVOCATE PODCAST

The Everyday Advocate Podcast features conversations on empowered leadership and healthy relationships as we work in the field of human trafficking.

Season two was comprised of 30 episodes and 27 guests who inspired us to grow as a mentor and leader in the everyday. Episodes can be found wherever you listen to podcasts.



THRIVE

Due to resource constraints, our Thrive parent & guardian groups were put on pause for 2024. However, we were thrilled to host a training for six individuals from two agencies across the US, equipping them to implement the Thrive program for guardians of trafficked and exploited youth within their communities.

AMPLIFY TRAINING & CONSULTING

AMPlify supports non-profit organizations serving youth survivors of trafficking and sexual exploitation by providing trauma-informed training and resources. From local agencies to national conferences, our team desires to share from what we have learned utilizing best practices and research-based program elements.

Over 800 community members were either trained or introduced to the topic of human trafficking by Allies in 2024.

One mentee, who typically shows little enthusiasm for activities and LinkUP! events, had an exceptional time visiting Dollie's Farm. She mentioned that while picking flowers, she could already picture how she wanted to arrange her crown. The finished product was not only stunning but also looked professionally crafted. Although she had never arranged flowers before, she expressed interest in exploring it further. She and her mentor also talked about visiting flower shops during their next outing to explore job or internship opportunities. This experience has sparked a potential career interest for her, and she is now excited about attending future events. It has opened up a career path she may never have considered before.





For this year's November LinkUP!, we hosted a Thanksgiving dinner, and it was truly uplifting to witness the support from local businesses. They not only provided a venue for us to gather, but also contributed a full Thanksgiving meal and gifts for the mentees. What was even more inspiring, though, was the encouragement we received from the mentees themselves. Before dinner, we invited everyone to share something they're thankful for, and it was heartening to hear so many express gratitude for Allies. One mentor, a survivor herself, bravely shared how gratitude has played a role in her healing journey. On the way home, when she asked her mentee if she had enjoyed the evening, her mentee responded, "Yes! My favorite part was meeting new people and realizing I'm not alone."

Each fall, Allies hosts a fall gathering - complete with pumpkin painting, s'mores, fall treats and sometimes even a hayride. Many of these fall activities that seem ordinary to us are experienced for the very first time by some mentees at these gatherings. This year, one mentee brought her two young children to the gathering. It was truly heartwarming to see her offer her children an experience she never had at their age. This moment reflects the powerful, generational impact of healthy relationships and a supportive community, showing just how much of a difference they can make!





Our December LinkUP! was truly a night to remember! Commitment was on full display at The Nutcracker. Mentors drove their mentees from various cities in the state (Kokomo, Lafayette, Carmel, and more) to the Old National Center (and back home) to enjoy a special night together. Donors generously donated gift cards for each match to enjoy dinner prior to the performance. Gifted Gown generously donated dresses for mentees to feel beautiful in and the Indianapolis Ballet generously donated tickets for the show. Each mentee went home with personalized gifts thanks to Secret Santas from all over the city.

The next day, we received text messages from mentees saying:

"I thought it was AMAZING!!!! I think it really sparked an interest in ballet shows I wanna go to a million more and I wanna see the Swan Lake one day, for sure! Thank you!!!"
